Lewd and Lascivious Behavior on August 13, 2018

On August 13, 2018 a woman reported that at 11:28 a.m. she was walking east on Memorial Drive on the KU campus. A man in a white truck stopped to ask her a question. The man in the truck was masturbating and drove away westbound.

Why are you receiving this Crime Alert?

Crime Alerts may be issued via e-mail for any of the following reasons:

- to seek assistance in the investigation of a crime
- to aid in the prevention of similar crimes
- to alert the KU community to off-campus crimes or crimes not covered by the Clery Act
- to notify the KU community about criminal incidents reported on campus that represent a serious or continuing threat, pursuant to the Clery Act

Is there an immediate threat to campus that requires immediate action?

No. When there is an immediate threat or immediate action is required, the university will issue a Campus Alert via its multi-tiered emergency notification system, which can include text messages, email, the on-campus public address system, social media and the university website. Examples of situations that would constitute an immediate threat include an armed intruder, bomb threat, gas leak, terrorist incident, hazardous waste spill, large fire, or explosion.
